
Year 4 Exhibition

Safeguarding



Around one in three children now has a social media account, which makes it increasingly important for trusted adults to understand what young people are viewing, sharing and experiencing online. Social media can sometimes lead children down unhelpful pathways that affect their wellbeing, and while platforms continue to grapple with managing content that is *legal but harmful*, the impact on young people can be significant. Although the scale and influence of technology companies can feel overwhelming, there is still much we can do to support children's mental health — helping them recognise when something doesn't feel right and knowing how to respond if online content causes worry or distress.

The guide shared includes practical advice for families, such as how to hide or block unsuitable content, set daily screen-time limits,

and encourage open conversations about what children may have seen or experienced online. Digital devices are a big part of everyday life for children and young people, but it can be tricky to balance the benefits with potential risks.
