Ofsted Report

Cherry Garden was inspected by Ofsted in July 2018. Having been 'Good' at our last inspection in February 2015, we received a shorter, one day inspection. Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)

We pride ourselves on being a welcoming and inclusive school. We believe that no child should be denied a high quality education because of a special need or disability and do our very best to ensure that every child receives the support they need and deserve. All children are different and have the right to access a broad and balanced curriculum that will enable them to make good progress.

Our SEND Leader, Miss Cook, is there to ensure your child's needs are being met. We monitor the progress of all children at regular intervals and decide if any child requires additional support to succeed. If we have concerns about your child's progress or their current rates of learning we will always contact you early to develop a plan for meeting your child's needs.

Additional support can take a range of forms, depending on the need of the child and the skills of the staff. The school has a dedicated team of teaching assistants who run a variety of intervention programmes aimed at 'closing gaps' in children's learning.

Occasionally, the school and child may need some additional support beyond that the school staff can give. In these instances, we have a number of agencies with whom we work closely, these include the school nurse, Educational Psychology, Speech and Language Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Educational Welfare and CAMHS (Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service).

To ensure that we are able to start meeting your child's needs as quickly as possible, when starting at Cherry Garden, whether that be in Reception or any other year group, we ask parents or carers to complete a short questionnaire about their child's needs.

Cherry Garden is committed to building on each child's strengths in order to secure high quality outcomes. A copy of our SEND Policy, along with a set of frequently asked questions, can be found on our website.



Partnership with Families

At Cherry Garden, we know the value of working together. Your child is on a path to success when home and school are giving the same messages around values, behaviour and the importance of study and learning. We recognise the huge role that families must play in the education of their child – from the basics of making sure children attend school regularly and on time, to supporting children with their learning at home.

Cherry Garden have a number of initiatives and strategies in place to support learning at home. Firstly, all children have a school planner. Within the school planner are a number of support materials such as number lines, times tables chart and place value grids. Across the school year, we run a number of workshops for parents and carers to help them understand how the school teaches different subjects and how these can be supported at home using the resources provided. Our workshops, as well as focusing on subjects such as maths and English, have also looked at wider issues such as internet safety and health education.

The school planners are also a place where children record their homework and their reading at home – all children have spellings homework, most classes have maths homework as well, and all children are expected to read at home at least three times a week.

The planners are also a place of celebration – if children receive a gold star in class for their outstanding behaviour or effort then these are stuck into the planners for sharing at home. When children reach a landmark of gold stars, 10, 25, 50 or maybe even 100, they are presented with a special certificate in celebration assembly on a Friday morning.



Communication between home and school is key, and we keep in touch via weekly newsletters, a school to home text messaging system and emailing of letters and key documents. In addition to our parent consultation evenings, we also hold regular 'Look at Learning' events where parents and carers are able to visit their child's class during the day to see learning in action. All our teachers make themselves available at the classroom door each day before school and at the end of the day, and Mr Hutchings is regularly on the school gate at key times to keep in touch and provide an opportunity for anything you may wish to discuss.

Celebrating Learning and Achievements

At Cherry Garden, Celebration Assemblies are one of the main ways in which we celebrate the children's achievements across the week. There are a number of awards, including VIPs (Values in Practise), Teacher Certificates and the Eco Award. We also like

to celebrate children's achievements outside of school, so challenges like the summer reading challenge are all welcomed. All families are welcome to join us for Celebration Assembly, but if we know a child will be receiving an award, we send a text home on the Thursday evening to give families the opportunity to see their child receiving their award.

In addition to our weekly Celebration Assemblies, there are also a number of other key times in the year where families are able to join us to celebrate learning and achievements. Throughout the year, we hold a number of themed days or weeks, and at the end of these times, we will often have a gallery or assembly to share what we have been up to! Recent examples include our Tudor Week, Spirited Arts Week and Internet Safety Day.



We also invite families in to celebrate at key times of the year. Our Harvest Assembly, Nativities, Carols by Candlelight, Sports Day and Summer Production are always well attended and are a great opportunity to see the children performing and enjoying their work.

If individual classes have been working hard on a specific project then we will also give families the chance to visit school and share that learning, for example Year 1 Pirate Singing Project, Year 4 Ukulele and Year 5 VE Day project.







Breakfast Club



Cherry Garden runs a breakfast club every day of the week. The club begins at 7:45am each morning and lasts until 8:45am, at which time the school day begins. There is a daily entry fee, currently £2.50. Pre-booking is required for this club but is done easily through the school's School Money online system. We recognise that many parents who use the club would like their child to have breakfast before coming to school, but for those who

wish for their child to eat on site, there is the opportunity to buy various breakfast items such as toast, cereal, warm and cold drinks. The breakfast club is run on a 'not-for-profit' basis and all entry fees cover costs and resources. At the club, children have access to a wide number of toys and games as well as art and craft resources. The club is run by school staff who are familiar to the children.

After School Childcare

There is also an after school childcare club available to the children of Cherry Garden. This club runs from 3:20pm until 6:00pm, currently from Monday to Thursday, and is run by a private provider (OOSC) on our school site. OOSC have a number of after school clubs at other South Gloucestershire schools and are an experienced provider. Although they are an external provider, they are very much part of the Cherry Garden team and share

our values and ethos. The club have full use of the school's facilities, including our half-acre conservation area. The club at Cherry Garden is inspected by Ofsted and in their most recent inspection achieved the highest possible rating. After School Clubs

Cherry Garden offer a number of after school clubs for the children. All of these clubs are **free** and are provided by a mixture of professional sports coaches, school staff and volunteers. The school invests heavily in providing these clubs – as a school we believe that family finances must not be a barrier to education and enjoyment.

Across the school year, there are a wide range of clubs, including but not exclusively, sports themed clubs. The clubs are open to different year groups across the year with the aim of ensuring that all children have the opportunity to follow their interests or perhaps try something new.

Some of our sporting clubs then feed into our representative school teams where we compete against other local schools in a range of fixtures.

Over the last few years, the clubs that we have offered have included:

Educational Visits

Educational visits have a role to play in enhancing and enriching the curriculum that we offer at Cherry Garden. We recognise that they are not cheap for families and therefore all visits are carefully chosen for the way in which they can have maximum impact on children's learning. Every class will have at least one visit to a place of interest each year. More and more, we are trying to maximise the opportunities in the immediate area around school and therefore will also visit a number of local places on foot each year.

In Year 6, our pupils have the opportunity to go on a residential visit with the school. In 2023 the children visited Woodhouse Park Activity Centre where they took part in a range of outdoor activities, such as abseiling, climbing, adventure course and go-karting. For some of our children it is their first experience away from home, but for all children it is exciting and character-building!



School Uniform

We have a bright, instantly recognisable school uniform which we expect all children to wear every day. We encourage children to feel proud of their school and wearing our uniform shows that they are part of our school family.

We recognise that uniform can be expensive and to help with this, we have a dedicated group of parents who run a regular second-hand uniform shop which sells high quality, low cost uniform for a fraction of the new cost. Several families have found this offer increasingly helpful over the last year.

Items with the school logo can be purchased directly from our school uniform provider. We also offer bookbags and jackets with the school logo.

Parent Teacher Association (PTA)

Cherry Garden has an active PTA who organise a range of fundraising activities across the school year. All parents and carers are automatically members of the PTA but some people choose to play a highly active role in the organisation.

The work of the PTA is critical to the school – they continually help to provide additional funds to the school to ensure that children have access to a growing number of high quality resources and opportunities within school.



Across the last few years, the PTA have organised Christmas Fayres, Summer Fayres, a number of discos and film nights and regular cake sales. These events have meant that in the last three years, the school has been able to purchase new interactive teaching screens for every classroom, a set of 20 iPads for classroom use, new playtime equipment for the pupils, a new climbing wall, enhance our 'quiet area' on the main playground, and purchase some excellent mathematical resources for use in every classroom.

The Magic Forest



Our Conservation Area (or Magic Forest as our Reception and Year One pupils know it) is half an acre of woodland at the rear of the school. It is completely and safely enclosed by secure fencing and is a wonderful space in which to learn and play. In this space, as well as plenty of trees and other plants, we also have an open area with a patio space.

Apart from using it to learn about nature and the world around us, we also use it for a whole range of activities such as building structures for Design Technology, Inter-House Treasure Hunts, and forest skills such as cooking on open fires and hanging hammocks. It has even been known to host nests of Dragon Eggs which have been discovered and then used for inspiration in writing!





Our School Council have worked on finding safe and fun ways in which we can use it at lunch times for play and discovery, and have helped to develop a set of rules and guidelines for everyone. Through the work of the School Council with Mr Hutchings, we have recently made some exciting additions to the Magic Forest which have included a much-improved and larger pond, a tree house and a rope swing. Our new wildlife camera also helps us to catch glimpses of the animals that inhabit the forest.

We are very fortunate to have such an incredible space within our grounds and are always looking for new and innovative ways in which to use it.
