COLD WEATHER

- Keep hot drinks and cold/flu medicines out of reach of children and remember cough sweets can be a choking hazard
- Wear bright clothing outdoors and take extra care crossing roads
- Teach children not to play on ice
- In cars, keep anti-freeze in a safe place and avoid wearing bulky coats in car seats
- Turn off electric fires when not in use and use electric blankets or hot water bottles safely
- Keep babies warm but avoid using hoods and head coverings indoors, don't put cots next to radiators and avoid novelty sleeping bags
