#### Reading at home

We know that it can be hard to get your children to read at home and have therefore been encouraging them to want do so regularly. We are celebrating those that do with praise, stickers and other rewards. If your child reads at home at least 5 times in a week and it is recorded in their diary, they will get a special reading sticker in their book. If they repeat this the following week they will get a 'reading reward'. We will check reading records every week (Monday to Sunday).

#### Phonics

Reception have been reading words with short vowels and have learnt the tricky words some, come, love and do.

Year One are revising previously taught sounds in preparation for the Year One Phonics Screening assessment in June. They have revised the following sounds/ spelling patterns - 'ie' e.g. pie, 'i-e' e.g. time, 'o' e.g. go and 'o-e' e.g. home.

#### Maths

Reception have been practising counting to 100, estimating objects up to 20 and ordering non-sequential numbers, identifying which number is the highest/ lowest.

Year One have been finding 1 more, 1 less, 10 more and 10 less from any given number to 100. They explored patterns on a 100 square related to this. They have also been focusing on place value in 2 digit numbers and identifying the 10s and 1s.

Table and division this week are 4.


