**Times tables:**

**Year 4 return to the 9x table.**

**Years 5 and 6 moving on to the 9x table in division form, e.g.:  $45 \div 9 = 5$ ,  $27 \div 9 = 3$**

**Homework this week:** There is a different homework this week based on a history research task about Tudor Explorers. There will be the usual spelling test (week 19) after the break.

**Yr6:** 3 pages in the CGP Maths book on Shapes (p.71,72&73)

English: 2 pages in the Grammar book on Brackets and Dashes for Extra Information (p.48-49).

**Yr5:** Maths: A sheet on the properties of Triangles and Quadrilaterals.

English: 2 pages in the Grammar book on Commas after fronted adverbials (p.46-47).

**Yr4:** Maths: A sheet on the properties of Triangles and Quadrilaterals.

English: 2 pages in the CGP book on Commas to separate clauses (p.44-45).

**Friday PE request:** As we are doing hockey this term on Fridays, if any of the children have **mouth guards** or **shin pads**, they may be brought into school for these sessions. The children have been taught about using hockey sticks safely and this will be monitored closely but, particularly when we start playing small-sided games in a couple of weeks, there is still the possibility of accidental injury.
