### Mrs Truslove/Mrs Banks – Red class

#### Phonics

**Reception** have been reading words ending in ing, ed and d. They have also been revising the previously taught sounds and tricky words.

**Year One** will now be revising all taught sounds and words for the rest of the term in preparation for year 2.

#### Maths

**Reception** have been exploring length, weight and capacity and learning how to compare each of these using direct comparison. They then moved onto using uniform non-standard units to measure a length, height, capacity and weight. Finally they compared more than 2 lengths using non - standard units.

**Year One** used number facts/ bonds to add and subtract 1-digit numbers to and from 2-digit numbers. They also used their number facts/bonds to find change from 10p and 20p.

### Mrs Gibbins – Green class

Homework is in the blue book.

We have finished our times tables for this year. The children have brought their booklets home.

Spelling continues as normal.

A number of children keep forgetting their reading records. Please can you remind them to bring them every day. Thank you.

### Mrs Pickles/Mr Wilkinson – Blue Class

**Please ensure that you check and sign your child's homework diary each week.**

Times tables: We are all continuing with mixed divisions (including Year 4) – all tables up to 12x12 in the inverse, e.g.  $96 \div 12 = 8$ ,  $35 \div 5 = 7$ .

**Yr4:** Maths: 2 Mathematics activities on Problem Solving.

English: 3 pages in the Grammar book on Headings, Subheadings and Prefixes (p.67, 68&69).
