Everyone is welcome to join us as we celebrate Harvest. There will be a collection for the Daventry Food Bank – please see the leaflet below for details of the collection. Items can be left at church or at the office.



Next Wednesday/Thursday we are holding Parents' Evening for all year groups. Please enter and leave through the office reception area so that we know who is in the building. If your children are with you, they will need to sit outside the classrooms where there will be seating and books. Pacesetters will be using the playground so unless your child is booked into their after school-club, they will need to stay with you. I look forward to seeing you all then.

I have been asked to remind you that after school club finishes at **5:00pm** promptly and that children should be picked up no later than this. This is now run by Pacesetters and their staff often go onto other schools/clubs which has a knock-on effect.

### Mrs Truslove/Mrs Banks – Red class

**Harvest words** - thank you to those who have been practising their Harvest lines at home. Please keep practising until they know them off by heart and encourage them to use a clear and loud voice.

### Phonics

**Reception** have learnt the new sounds ck, e, u and r. They have been reading words containing these sounds, practising oral blending and segmenting and writing these sounds using the correct letter formation. They have also learnt the tricky words is, I and the.

**Year One** have been reviewed the learning from this term and completed their phonic assessments. They all did amazingly- well done for all of your hard work this term.

### Maths

**Reception** have been learning about addition and subtraction. They started off the week by practising subitising numbers up to 6 using fingers and dots on a dice. They then moved on to finding number pairs to 5 and 6 and were shown the addition number sentence that went with each pair eg  $4+1=5$  /  $3+2=5$ . Finally, they were introduced to simple subtractions using their number pairs and learnt to recognise that adding and subtracting are inverse operations.

**Year One** have been revising this term's learning and completed their maths assessments. Again, they all did so well and should be proud of themselves.

### Mrs Gibbins – Green class

Next week we will be doing the 6x table

Homework is in the blue books as usual.

The children have stuck in a new 6 weekly spelling sheet in their reading record. These will begin the week we return after the half term holidays. (Friday 7<sup>th</sup> November). There is no spelling test next week.

The children are also bringing home some harvest words to practise. I would like them to learn these by heart as they are quite short, however they will need to practise their delivery. Thank you.

Next week in maths we will be continuing to work on multiplication and moving onto division.

English: 2 pages in the Grammar book on noun phrases (p.16 & 17).

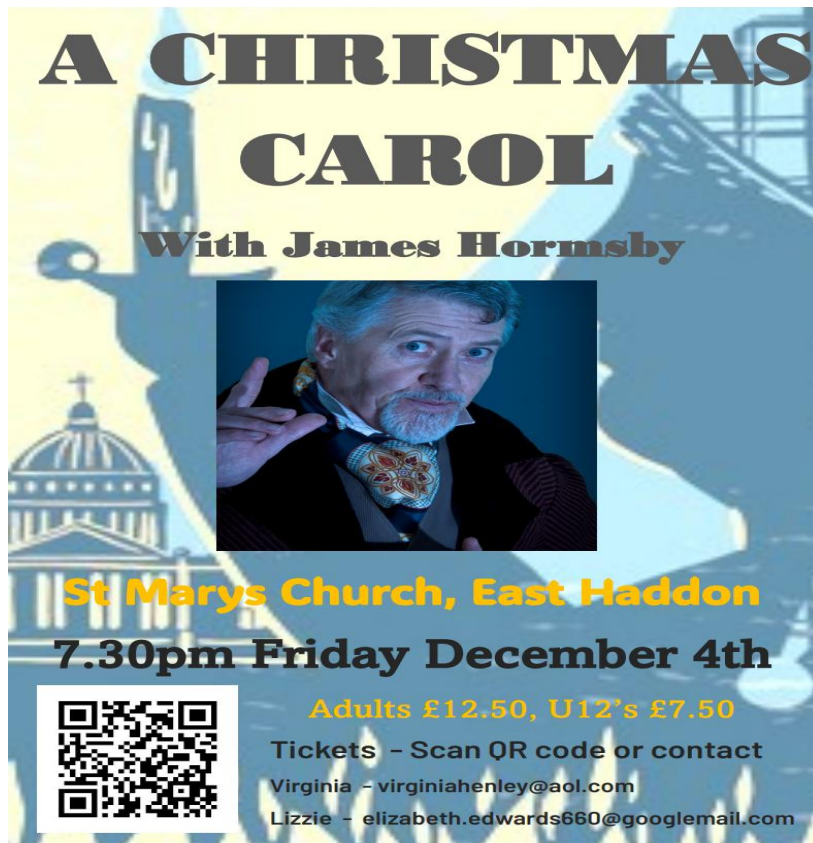
