Mrs Truslove/Mrs Banks – Red class

Our topic this term is Polar Explorers/ Snow and Ice. If your child has anything at home related to this topic they are more than welcome to bring it in to share with the class to support our learning.

Phonics

Reception have learnt the sounds ur (fur), ow (cow), oi (coin) and ear (fear). They have also learnt the tricky words my, by and all.

Year One have been growing the code! They have learnt that the l sound is sometimes spelt as le (e.g. apple) or al (e.g. metal), the s sound is sometimes spelt with a c (e.g. ice) and the v sound can be spelt as ve (e.g. give). They have also learnt the tricky words school, call and different.

Maths

Reception have begun to partition sets of 10 objects and learnt the number pairs/ bonds to 10. They have started to use the vocabulary add, more than and equals. The children have also learnt about doubling and halving and explored these concepts practically with objects, ten frames and their fingers.

Year 1 have focussed on addition. They have been adding by putting the larger number first and counting on (numbers up to 100), spotting unit patterns, counting on from 2 digit numbers and adding a 1 digit number to a 2 digit number.

Mrs Gibbins – Green class

Tables this week are the 8x. Homework is in the blue book.

In forest school this week we made posies to help us fight the evil plague!

Next week we will be bug hunting to collect data for computing. It's certainly a varied life in green class.

Mrs Pickles/Mr Wilkinson – Blue Class

Next week in maths we will be working on Angles.

Times tables: Year 4 return to the 3x table.

Years 5 and 6 moving on to the 3x table in division form, e.g.: $24 \div 3 = 8$, $15 \div 3 = 5$

Yr6: 4 pages in the CGP Maths book on factors, multiples, primes, squares & primes (p.23,24,25&26)

English: 2 pages in the Grammar book on Commas in Lists (p.40-41).

Yr4: Maths: 2 activities on Mathematics on Measure.

English: 2 pages in the CGP book on Question Marks and Exclamation Marks (p.38-39).

Friday PE request: As we are doing hockey this term on Fridays, if any of the children have **mouth guards** or **shin pads**, they may be brought into school for these sessions. The children have been taught about using hockey sticks safely and this will be monitored closely but, particularly when we start playing small-sided games in a couple of weeks, there is still the possibility of accidental injury.


