Mrs Truslove writes

Today our monthly online safety briefing has been uploaded to the website and will be attached to this newsletter. These are produced for us by a team who look at latest trends, youth culture and recent issues. They contain up to date information, advice and warnings about all things online and I would highly recommend that all parents have a read each month in order to keep children safe online (also useful for old people like me to know what is going on!).

Mrs Truslove/Mrs Banks – Red class

Phonics

Reception have learnt the sounds air (eg fair) and er (eg hammer). They have also been reading words with double letters such as ladder, hammer, attic, rubber, digger, puppet, puff and carrot. The tricky words taught this week were: are, sure and pure.

Year One have learnt the following spelling patterns: o-e, o and ou which make the 'u' sound in words eg some, mother, young, se which makes the 'z' sound in words eg cheese, se/ ce which make the s sound in words eg mouse/ fence and ey which makes the 'ee' sound in words eg donkey. They have also learnt the tricky words: thought, through, friend and work.

Maths

Reception have been learning how we can time events and the fact that some events take longer than others. They have improved their understanding of how time is measured and are beginning to recognise units of time (seconds, minutes, hours, days, months and years). They have also begun to recognise and identify common 3D shapes, learning to name cubes, spheres, cuboids, cones, pyramids and cylinders. Finally, they have begun to describe their properties, including the 2D shapes of their flat faces.

Year One have been naming, recognising and describing the properties of 3D shapes (cube, cuboid, cone, cylinder and sphere). They have also started to sort 3D shapes according to their properties. Following this the practised ordering and naming the days of the week and months of the year. We also discussed the seasons and used our seasons and birthday chart and monthly calendar displayed in the classroom to help us with this.
