#### Weekly Round-Up

It's certainly been a week of changing weather here at GJS — cold, frosty mornings and everything in between. As winter creeps in, please do make sure children bring a warm coat each day.



We completed our final week of swimming for 5MO, and once again the children showed fantastic improvement, confidence and enjoyment in the pool. Well done to everyone involved.

On Monday, we welcomed members of the Senior Team from the Oak Trees MAT. They were incredibly impressed by what they saw — especially the children's outstanding behaviour, attitudes to learning and the values they demonstrated both in and out of the classroom. Well done, everyone.

It has also been an excellent week for football:

- On Tuesday, our Year 4/5 team defeated Poulton Lancelyn 2–0 in the first round of the Corgi Cup, with a double from Theo and a brilliant defensive team effort.
- On Wednesday, our Girls' Team won the Tranmere Rovers Primary Stars competition, meaning they will represent Tranmere in the regional finals in the new year.

We are now through to both the outdoor (Everton) and indoor (Tranmere) regional finals — a truly fantastic achievement. Across every match, our teams have demonstrated the 3Cs beautifully: care, courtesy and consideration, all while competing with determination and teamwork.

This week we also held a Road Safety assembly. The children watched real-life examples, including a child's story about an unsafe decision that had long-lasting consequences. We discussed what happened, why, and how we can learn from it — as well as revisiting the key rule for crossing safely: **STOP – LOOK – LISTEN – THINK.** 

Thank you once again for the amazing generosity shown towards our Christmas Fair. We have received so many thoughtful donations and we greatly appreciate your support.

In the classrooms this week:

- Year 3 have been learning to code using Code Studio. The children explored sequencing and debugging and began creating simple programs with increasing confidence — we really do have some budding coders in our midst!
- Year 4 have been working incredibly hard on their persuasive leaflets. We have been very impressed with their use of expanded noun phrases, rhetorical questions and engaging persuasive language.
- Year 5 continued their swimming block, aiming for the National Curriculum standard and showing real determination in the pool.
- Year 6 have been writing non-chronological reports about tigers. After researching last week, the children produced formal, detailed and informative texts using their Y6 writing features with maturity and focus.



- Encourage them not to share photos or videos that might embarrass them now or in the future.












- Remind them to keep passwords private, strong, and not shared with friends.
