Toys and Personal Belongings

We would also like to kindly remind families that we discourage children from bringing toys and personal belongings such as "labubus" and other small items into school. home. This also helps children remain fully focused on their learning and avoid unnecessary distractions.




To help keep your child safe when gaming:
