






#### **Weekly Round-Up**

#### Online Safety – YouTube & Online Videos

Many children enjoy using YouTube for entertainment, tutorials, and learning videos. However, even when children start with age-appropriate content, the platform's recommended videos can quickly lead them to material that is not suitable for their age.

To help keep your child's viewing safe and positive:

#### Use YouTube Kids for younger users

YouTube Kids is designed specifically for children, with stronger content filters and the option for parents to hand-pick channels or videos. You can also set screen-time limits, disable the search function, and review your child's watch history. This helps ensure that what they access is appropriate and tailored to their age and interests.

#### **Turn on Restricted Mode**

If your child uses the standard YouTube app or website, switching on Restricted Mode can help hide content that has been flagged as inappropriate. Although not perfect, it provides an added layer of protection.

#### Watch or subscribe together

Take time to watch videos with your child or explore their subscriptions together. This not only helps you understand what they enjoy but also opens conversations about what is suitable and what to avoid.

#### Talk about adverts and influencers

YouTube is full of adverts, sponsorships, and influencer content. Encourage your child to think critically about what they see — not everything online is true, and many influencers are paid to promote products or ideas. These conversations help build digital resilience and healthy scepticism.
