It has been a real pleasure to welcome our pupils back to school this week and to see classrooms once again filled with energy, enthusiasm and smiling faces. The children have settled quickly into their routines and have returned with a fantastic attitude to learning. This has made for a very positive start to 2026, and we are incredibly proud of how focused and motivated everyone has been. We are looking forward to an exciting term ahead and to building on this excellent beginning together.



### In the classrooms this week:

- Year 3 have had an exciting and imaginative start to their new learning this week as they stepped into the Stone Age! To launch their new class text, *Stone Age Boy*, the children took part in a range of drama activities that brought this prehistoric period vividly to life. Year 3 are already asking brilliant questions and are eager to learn more about life in the Stone Age. This exciting start has set the tone for some fantastic learning ahead!
- Year 4 have made an exciting start to their new History topic, Anglo-Saxons and Vikings! After their first lesson, they are already curious about how history shaped our local area. Over the coming weeks, why not keep an eye out for clues around Wirral? Signs around Greasby, Upton and Thurstaston have fascinating Anglo-Saxon and Viking connections — a fun way to spot history in our own neighbourhood!
- Year 5 have enjoyed an exciting start to their new Science topic, Earth and Space! They have loved reading their linked text, *Darkest Dark*, and today they worked really hard exploring the solar system, learning fascinating facts about planets, orbits, and the wonders of space. It's been a stellar start to the term!
- Year 6 have made a strong and thoughtful start to their new dance unit this week. Using the song 'Two Tribes' by Frankie Goes to Hollywood, the children have been exploring how movement can be used to express emotions and tell a story. They began by working together as a whole class before moving into smaller groups to develop their own choreography.

### Parking Around School

## Online Safety

Over the Christmas period, some children may have received new devices such as tablets, phones or gaming consoles. While these offer exciting opportunities for learning and entertainment, it is important that pupils are supported to use them safely and responsibly. We want all children to be aware of potential online risks and to feel confident about how to stay safe when using apps, games and online tools at home.

Below are some simple suggestions to help parents and carers support their children with online safety.



- **Talk regularly with your child**

Ask them what apps, games or online tools they are using and who (or what) they are interacting with. Keeping conversations open and positive helps children feel comfortable sharing any worries.

- **Explain that online and AI “friends” are not real people**

Help children understand that chatbots and virtual friends do not have feelings and should not replace real friendships or trusted adults.

- **Remind children never to share personal information**

Children should not share names, ages, school details, addresses, photos or passwords online.

- **Check age ratings and privacy settings**

Make sure apps and games are age-appropriate and use parental controls and privacy settings where possible.

- **Encourage children to question what they see online**

Explain that information online is not always accurate and they should check with a trusted adult if something feels confusing or worrying.

- **Set clear boundaries around screen time**

Agree limits on when and how long devices can be used, particularly before bedtime.

- **Know how to report concerns**

Reassure children that they should tell a trusted adult straight away if anything online makes them feel uncomfortable, and show them how to block or report content if needed.

Thank you for your continued support in helping us keep our children safe online.
