Across the classrooms:

Year 3 investigated *how shadows change throughout the day* in Science, using torches and models to explore how the sun's position affects shadow size and direction. Brilliant curiosity and careful observation!

Year 4 finished their *Romans* topic by making clay Roman coins. Once dry over half term, they'll be painted gold, silver and bronze — a lovely way to round off the unit.

Year 5 took part in a powerful MEAS workshop on challenging hate, learning that everyone deserves respect regardless of background or culture — a timely reminder of our shared values.

Year 6, following on from Monday's visit from MEAS for *Black History Month*, explored how history can be distorted and how stereotypes are reinforced or challenged through social media. They created avatars that either highlighted or broke stereotypes — some brilliant, thought-provoking work!

Online Safety

Many children in Key Stage 2 are now using group chats through apps such as WhatsApp, Messenger, or Discord to stay in touch with friends. While these can be a fun way to connect, they can also lead to misunderstandings, unkind behaviour, or children seeing inappropriate content.



To help your child stay safe and positive online:

- Check the app's age rating for example, WhatsApp has a minimum age of 13.
- **Encourage kindness** remind children that the same rules of respect apply online as in person.
- Monitor group size and content large group chats can easily get out of control.
- Talk regularly ask your child what groups they're part of and how they feel about them.
