We are Scientists

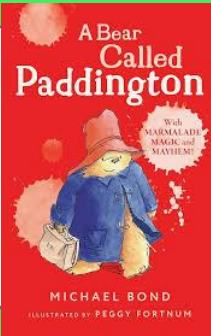
In Science, the children will be exploring materials that are suitable for specific purposes and learning about their properties. They will use actions such as stretching and bending to see how these actions affect the shape of solid objects. They will compare the suitability of materials by carrying out tests and recording data.



Maths

Our focus for this half term in Maths is Money, followed by Multiplication and Division. The children will have a quick recap of their recognition of coins from Year 1 and move onto counting money in pence. They will use their place value knowledge to add and subtract sums of money. In Multiplying, the children will learn to recognise equal and unequal groups and recognise multiplication as repeated addition.

We will be reading 'A Bear Called Paddington'. The children will answer a range of vocabulary, inference, prediction and retrieval questions. They will be writing a story based on the character Paddington Bear.
