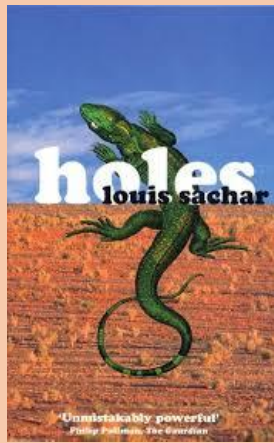
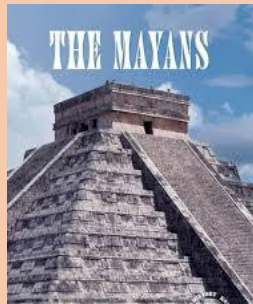


Year 6 Summer 2

ENGLISH

In English, we will be basing our Reading and Writing lessons on Holes, by Louis Sachar. We will explore language used, while using our VIPERS skills to unpick the text further. Following this, the children will use the storyline to write their own version in the form of a playscript. We will have a daily Writing lesson and a Reading lesson throughout this half-term.

Science

Making connections

Children will be using all of the knowledge and understanding that they have learnt during Year 6 to answer the question 'Are all Sunglasses Safe?'. We will draw our learning from our Electricity, Light and Reflection, Evolution and Inheritance, Circulation and Health and Classifying topics. Each lesson will require knowledge from these units, whilst enhancing their working scientifically skills.

Our PE lessons will be:

Cricket and **Athletics**.

The children will have their PE lessons on Wednesdays and Thursdays.

Maths learning:

This half term, the children will be applying their learning from not only Year 6, but all of Key Stage Two. They will use their knowledge for a variety of real life scenarios, such as going on holiday and hosting a pizza party.

Computing

In our weekly Computing lesson, the children will learn about:

Programming - Sensing movement

In this module, the children will have the opportunity to utilise a physical device — the micro:bit. The unit begins with a simple program for pupils to build in, and test, within the new programming environment, before transferring it to their micro:bit

History

In our History lessons, the children will be learning about the Mayan Civilisation. Over this topic, the children will sequence the key periods of Maya history and contrast them with what was happening in Britain at the same time. They will explore how the Maya successfully settled in the challenging rainforest environment and identify the unique features of their cities. By investigating artifacts and evaluating different theories about the civilization's decline, pupils will make deductions about daily life and religious beliefs. Finally, the class will discover how archaeologists, archivists, and historians work together to construct our understanding of the past.

In PSHE, our MyHappyMind weekly sessions will focus on the 'Engage' module. The children focus on understanding what goal setting is. They learn the purpose and value of setting goals. They also explore how setting goals can help them improve and stay motivated.

We will visit the Library every
Friday afternoon.
