

**3-5** dolls and action figures, cars, lorries, DVDs and CDs (music and nursery rhymes), colouring sets, pencils, crayons, books, puzzles

**5-9** educational games & toys, stationery (colouring sets, pencils, crayons, school sets), CDs & family friendly DVDs, books, puzzles, wordsearch, crosswords

**9-12** games and toys, stationery, DVDs, books, t-shirts, hair accessories, gloves, scarves, hats

**13-16** books, make-up and toiletries (please try to ensure non-allergic ingredients if possible), gloves, scarves, hats, t-shirts, hair accessories and gift vouchers.

Please be aware there is NO pressure to purchase any item this is purely a voluntary donation as we fully understand Christmas is a very expensive time for all families. *Any donations can be handed into the office for our display in the hall from 1st December.* These will then be collected by the Salvation Army before we break up.

Kent County Council is partnering with researchers at UCL, Durham and Newcastle Universities to invite parents from our school to take part in the **SHINE Parent & Carer Survey**.

Make sure you order your child's Christmas Dinner by Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> December. This is now available to book on MCAS. The date of Christmas Dinner is Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> December. If you do not order a dinner you will need to provide your child with a festive packed lunch.

Healthy lunchboxes – We have noticed that many children are bringing in their lunch boxes with very unhealthy choices. Chocolate bars are NOT ALLOWED and will be sent home. Please ensure your child has a healthy lunchbox ie sandwich/roll/wrap fruit or cucumber/tomatoes and only ONE chocolate biscuit (penguin, two finger kit-kat, rocky etc). Chocolate bars are NOT ALLOWED and will be sent home.



The final day for After School Clubs will be Friday 5<sup>th</sup> December due to the Christmas Events which will be taking place during the last weeks of term. Next term there will be new after school clubs for you to sign your child up to.

# Are you eligible?

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)



Please come and speak to us if you believe you may be eligible or go to the Government website to check. Apply for free school meals - GOV.UK

Not only will your child receive a free school meal throughout their education (not just in years R, 1 and 2) but you will receive food vouchers during the holiday period and a heating allowance. It also allows your child to access free holiday clubs and activities.

In addition to this the school receives an extra £1,480 each year, for each child in receipt of a free school meal, which can make a big change to the interventions and support we can offer. Even if your circumstances change your child will continue to receive a free school meal throughout the whole of their time at school once they have been accepted.

# **FOBS Update**

On Monday 17<sup>th</sup> November we held our FOBS AGM. I am pleased to be able to report that FOBS have a very healthy balance of 9.3k for us to spend on the children in our school.

Our current plans for spending the money raised is to further develop the Fir Tree outside area by levelling the top area and having a sand shed for the children to play in, with buckets, spades and toys for digging, complete with a gardening area for the children to nurture and grow plants. The older children would also like an outdoor stage area, complete with benches to watch their shows! Finally, the children across the school have spoken about an area for reflection, where they can go to should they need a quiet moment in the school day, again they would like this outside area to have benches and be a welcoming place to sit. These projects will cost us a large amount of money as we want these areas to be nice places for your children to learn and play. The money raised will be used for these projects.

The FOBS team have previously signed us up to the school lottery and easy fundraising. There will be further information on these on the FOBS newsletter which will soon be shared with you.

There were several ideas raised during the meeting, one of which was to have a voice for each year group who becomes the spokesperson and go between for that year group; between their year group and the FOBS team, putting messages sent from FOBS onto their year group chats and relaying ideas back to the chair – Beth Watkins (Jude's mum). If you think you can help with the coordination between your year group and FOBS team, please give your name and number to the school office and they will pass this on. This will stop having to have such a large FOBS WhatsApp group.

We are also looking at having mini teams who take charge of an event, i.e. Easter Egg team, gift sale team, Break the Rules day team, raffle team, tea towel team, pumpkin plant growing team...If you feel this is something you would be interested in taking on board, whether on your own or with a group of parents please come and speak to Mrs Cox or the school office and they will be able to tell you more about what these jobs entail.

The Gift Sale will take place on Friday 12<sup>th</sup> December – any volunteers are most welcome. If you would like to help run a stall, please see Mrs Lindsay (Millie + William's mum) or pop into the office for more information. Please make sure your child is sent into school with their money in a named purse/wallet/envelope and a gift bag to take their presents home.
