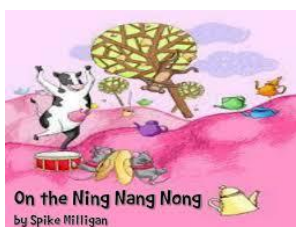
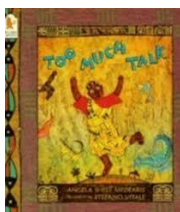


Dear parents,

In summer 2 we will base our learning around the text: *'Too much Talk'* by Angela Shelf Medearis. *Too much Talk* is a classic West African folktale. The story features rhythmic and repetitive language making it a perfect model for children to write their own narrative around. We will also be looking at the poem 'On the Ning Nang Nong' by Spike Milligan.



This half term we will be focusing on developing our narrative skills- building a story that is interesting for the reader. We will also be learning about the features of different types of poems and will be performing and writing our own poems

This term in reading we will be focusing on all of the reading skills we have learned this year and applying them to help us ask and answer comprehension style questions. We read a class novel together every day. We are currently reading *'Awful Auntie'* by David Walliams. Children will vote for our new class text once we have finished this.

A consistent approach in the ARP is the use of 'Colourful Semantics' to support spoken language that aids with writing. Here, again, is some information for you to read about 'Colourful Semantics' online:

We continue to use **Bug Club** for practising reading and using strategies to decode unknown words as well as to support comprehension. Please continue to access **'Bug Club'** and **'Purple Mash'** at home to support your child's reading skills.

The children are familiar and confident with both programs.

Children are given spellings to learn every Friday- children will usually have the same set of spellings for two weeks- they are tested three times a week on these spellings and also complete a dictation session based on their spellings. Children can also log on to purple mash and complete spelling quizzes linked to their weekly spellings. This is something that we practised in class last half term so all children are familiar with how to access the spelling quizzes. Please ensure that your child practises over the weekend.
