This has also been our *Anti-Bullying Week*, with the theme 'Make a Noise About Bullying – Use Your Power for Good.' We began on Monday with a whole-school assembly led confidently by our School Council. The children also wore odd socks to celebrate that we are all unique. At West Acton, we emphasise that anti-bullying is not confined to one week; no one should ever feel bullied here, and children are always encouraged to speak out.

On Monday, the School Council also sold poppies and on Tuesday the whole school gathered on the playground for a very moving two-minute silence to recognise the devastating effects of war.

It was also wonderful to welcome new parents for our **Reception Cohort 2026** at the Open Events held this Tuesday and last week. They were extremely complimentary and impressed with our school, our environment and the warm, positive atmosphere created by our staff and children.

Thank you as well to the parents who gave up their time last night to attend our annual Online Safety Meeting. The presentation was extremely informative and highlighted the increasing risks children face when exposed to inappropriate content online, as seen more and more in recent news. It was wonderful to see those parents engaging so thoughtfully with such an important topic.

I also had to write again this week to remind families that **our car park** is **not** a **playground**, and that the school site must not be entered before 8:30am unless a member of staff has opened the gates and invited you in. Please do not slip in behind cars or staff members as they enter — this is a significant health and safety concern.






School starts at 8.45am

Music so far at West Acton

A message from your music teacher

I am so impressed by the musicality at West Acton Primary School. Across KS1 and KS2 the sense of rhythm through movement, playing instruments and reading notation is very clear. There is also a love for music outside of the syllabus which I have been very lucky to hear about. From songs and raps with accompanying dance routines being choreographed from some of the girls in Zaytnouna. Along with pupils requesting to sing songs which we have learnt in class and ones which they have heard at home, for their class. Special mention for Neyson in year 4 who sang beautifully at the start of our music class a few weeks ago. Anytime I ask if someone would like to perform a song or rhyme for the rest of the class I am always received with a lot of volunteers. I am grateful to be part of such a vibrant community which has clearly been nurtured and cultivated excellently by Ms Kondo and all the other members of staff.

EYFS were looking at Moving and Clapping

Reception sang songs and rhymes, moving in time to the beat. We listened to different styles of music, shared how they made us feel, and played instruments to a steady pulse.

In KS1 we were focussing on Pulse

In **Year 1** We explored pulse and tempo and learnt to feel the beat. We joined in call and response songs following a leader and practised pitch-matching.

Year 2 sang, played instruments and moved to music to develop their skills as musicians. We focused on pulse and tempo, finding strong beats and noticing changes in music.



Singing Assembly Song of the Term:

We don't have music assemblies. But the KS2 after school choir is learning 'how far I'll go' from the film Moanna.

The KS2 focus area was Performing: Reading Notation - Rhythm

Year 3 focussed on reading musical notation and they learnt more about rhythm and tempo. We practised reading, writing and playing rhythms and improved our singing skills.

In **Year 4**, we explored music in 2, 3 and 4 time, listening to a variety of recorded music and singing songs and rounds from around the world. We worked on a rhythm ensemble that used the rhythm "syncopa". Some key words we learnt were bar, bar lines, metre, minim and rest.



Year 5 studied music in 2/4, 3/4 and 4/4. We sang rounds, analysed recorded music, read and performed rhythmic phrases, and learnt technical rhythm names crotchet rest, paired quavers and semiguavers.

In **Year 6**, we developed rhythm reading and ensemble skills. We sang in parts, explored music from different genres, performed as a 4 part rhythm ensemble, and refined our ability to read and write rhythms.
