TIP FROM SCHOOL THERAPIST MRS PEARCE

Every mistake is a learning opportunity

We all experience challenging moments when we realise, we haven't said or done the right thing. Sometimes our emotional reserves are so full that we lose sight of our children's perspective or struggle to understand their point of view.

We might get cross, shout, react to their behaviours and later feel guilty and filled with remorse.

Naturally, it can be hard to stay patient and calm when we are faced with challenging behaviours from our children.

It is helpful to remind ourselves that most things can be repaired.

How parents can make a difference:

- ❖ Parenting can be challenging and as humans we don't need to be perfect. Our children should have the freedom to be imperfect as well, while feeling loved and accepted just as they are.
- ❖ Fortunately, we can model how to repair by saying something like 'I'm sorry for raising my voice; you didn't deserve that. Let's go back and try again. What I meant to say was....'
- ❖ If we follow ruptures with reconnection and ensure that there are more positive experiences with our children, these difficult moments can become valuable learning opportunities.



Let's stay open to learning from our mistakes and work to mend any disconnects as soon as possible.

TOP TIP!! Thinking about 'HOW' we ask our children to do something, will really make a difference.

For example, If I say, "Don't think of a Kangaroo". What image/thought comes to your mind?!

A kangaroo!!



 DO	 Don't
DO listen when someone is talking to you	Don't ignore or interrupt a person talking to you
DO put your coat, shoes, etc. away when you come in	Don't leave your things lying around
DO stay at the table once meals have started	Don't leave the table in the middle of meals
DO be gentle with each other	Don't hurt, hit or bite each other
DO ask before borrowing something	Don't take anyone else's things without asking
DO play ball games outside	Don't play ball games in the house

It is the same with our children. Let's try asking what **WE WANT** them to do rather than what we DON'T want them to do. Have a go! It might take some time to get used to saying "DO" and not "Don't"!!



In reception this week we have been celebrating Black History Month. We have been reading the book 'The Leopard's Drum' by Jessica Souhami. The children were inspired by the leopard and made their own fantastic African drums. They enjoyed cutting, sticking and choosing their own patterns. Have a look at the amazing drums they have made!

Autumn term Science Challenge

Equipment:

- Kitchen roll (1 sheet)
- Felt tip pens (at least 5 different colours)
- 2 small cups or glasses
- Water

Instructions:

1. Cut 1 sheet of kitchen roll into a strip about 5 cm wide.
2. Use your felt tip pens to colour thick blocks at each end of the strip (same colours on both ends, about 2-3 cm high). Leave the middle blank!
3. Fill 2 small cups halfway with water. Place one end of the paper strip into each cup so that the coloured ends are just in the water. The middle of the strip should arch between the cups.
4. Over the next 10-30 minutes, observe what happens.

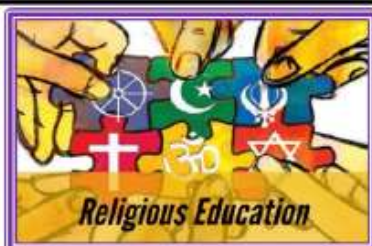
