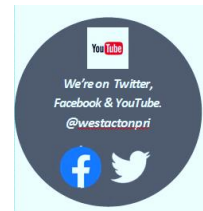

In your email, make sure to include **contact details of a responsible adult** (parent/carer). You **must** state which **age category** you are entering into and include **your full name, age and school**.

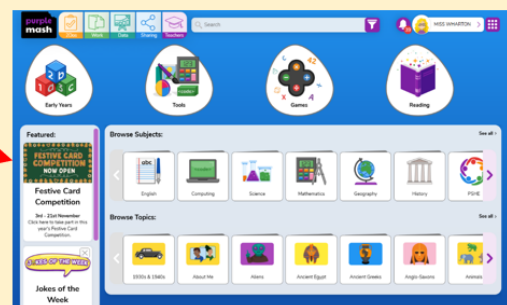
2. Purple Mash Christmas Card

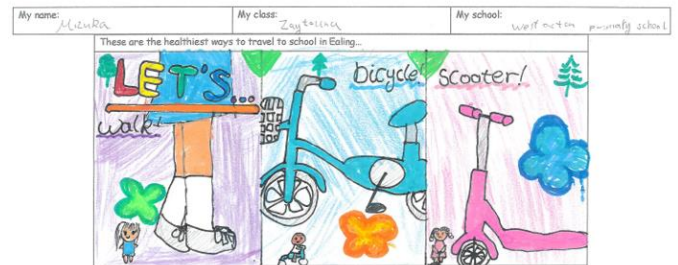

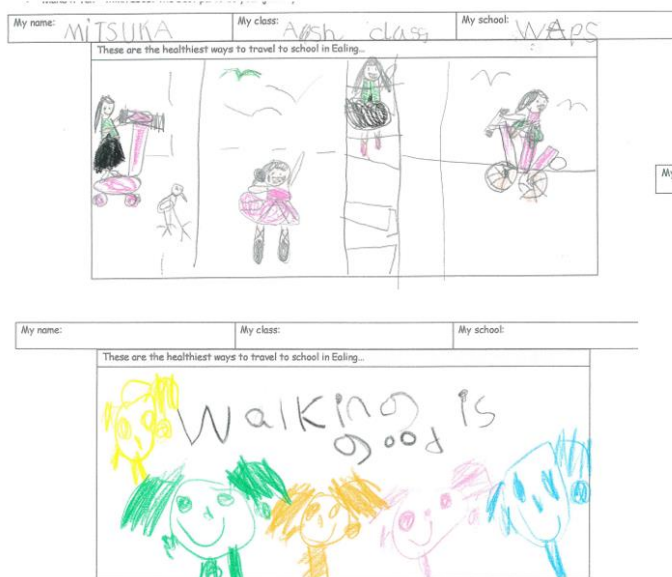

Re: Home Reading

Dear Parents/Carers,

At West Acton Primary School, we highly value the importance of reading because we know that this is a life-skill that is needed in all areas of learning. Pupils who are able to decode unfamiliar words; read fluently and develop good habits of reading for enjoyment are more likely to make good progress in all areas of their learning and achieve success through career opportunities in the future. This is backed by research carried out by top educational bodies.

Therefore, we ask pupils of West Acton Primary to read at home for 20 minutes 5 times a week. This is so they can build fluency; learn new vocabulary; apply their phonics knowledge of sounding out and chunking up new words, as well as develop comprehension skills. Pupils who read 5 times a week at home are more likely to make expected progress across the year and will find it easier to access the learning that is appropriate for their age.

It is important that pupils practise this regular independent reading at a level that matches their actual reading level. To help pupils do this, they are given books of a certain colour-coded book band level. Pupils will need to read and re-read (if books are short) these books through the week to make expected progress and move up to the next book band level.

To help families develop an understanding of how their child is progressing in reading, please see below the home reading book band levels, which show how the books are matched to national expectations for different age groups. Some pupils who have been identified as working towards or working below the national standard for their year group (this means they are not quite reading at the level that is expected for their age) may be given additional support in school, where possible. If your child is offered additional support out of school hours, it is crucial that your child attends in order to help them keep up, as well as doing their regular reading at home.

Please see the book band levels below to see how your child relates to the expectations within their year group. These were shared at the recent parents' evening meetings.

Dear Parents/Carers,

Re: Online Safety – how to keep your child safe workshop for parents/carers

Parents/carers and schools are constantly working to keep our children safe and one place that this is even more important – yet even harder is the online virtual world, on the Internet and Social media. Our pupils learn and are reminded about online safety in their Computing lessons and this is revisited each week in PSHE, computing and assemblies.

To further support parents/carers at West Acton we are delighted to be able to welcome Emma Clarke, for our annual meeting. Emma will hold a session on **Thursday 13th November at 6.00pm online**. This will be during our Anti bullying week – many cases of bullying actually take place online. We hope that you will join us for this session online (not in school) – **a link will be sent to you in the by of the Thursday 13th November** for the meeting to start at 6.00pm. This is parents and carers, not children.

The online world is a wonderful place and always changing. Unfortunately, this also means children face new and different risks when they are online. The media regularly highlights issues around keeping children safe when online and parents are understandably anxious about how best to keep their children safe and happy while online. It can be hard to keep up. This session will look at what some of the risks are, how parents/carers can best support their children to avoid problems and what to do if anything goes wrong. The presentation will be available online to all parents after the session.

Emma Clarke is the Education Safeguarding Adviser for Achieving for Children, a not-for-profit social enterprise company created in 2014. A registered social worker, she works alongside parents and carers, school staff and governors, children and young people, social workers, front line professionals and the local authority designated officer (LADO) in helping to keep children and young people safer, both online and offline.

Re: Together we thrive — Inclusion at the heart of West Acton Primary

Following on from our success in achieving the *Inclusion Quality Mark (IQM) Inclusive School Award* in July, I am delighted to share that **West Acton Primary School has now been recognised as a Centre of Excellence for Inclusion.**

This new recognition places our school among a select group of institutions nationally celebrated for their deep and sustained commitment to equity, diversity and inclusion. The assessors described West Acton as *"a place where inclusion is not just an action but the natural outcome of comprehensive efforts to welcome, value and enhance the lives of all children and the community they serve."*

The report praised our *"deeply embedded culture of inclusion"* and our ethos that *"inclusion is not just a policy but a lived value"*, visible in every classroom, playground and interaction across the school community.

The recognition highlights:

- A **vibrant, multicultural learning environment**, with over 660 pupils speaking multiple languages and representing a wide range of cultural backgrounds.
- **Strong provision for pupils with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND)**, including our Additionally Resourced Provision (ARP) for children with autism.
- A **trauma-informed, therapeutic approach** to wellbeing, including in-house psychotherapy, group sessions and the use of tools such as Zones of Regulation and Microsoft Reflect.
- A **curriculum that is adaptive, inclusive and culturally responsive**, using visual supports, digital tools and decolonised content to make learning accessible for all.
- **Excellent relationships with parents and carers**, built on trust, flexibility and open communication, particularly supporting families new to the UK education system.

Being recognised as a **Centre of Excellence** not only celebrates the inclusive practice already embedded at West Acton but also positions us as a school that will share expertise and collaborate with others nationally. We will be part of a network of schools developing new approaches to inclusion and continuing to learn from each other.





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I am incredibly proud of this achievement. It reflects the dedication of our staff, the strength of our partnerships with families, and above all, the resilience and brilliance of our children. At West Acton, we believe every child should feel they belong, are valued and can succeed.

This recognition also embodies our **core values of Courage, Consideration and Collaboration**. TIP FROM SCHOOL THERAPIST MRS PEARCE

Wellbeing tip: Returning to school after a break

We've been back at school for a few days now, but some of the worries posted into the Safe TT spot this week have shown that returning after even a short break can still feel tricky. Some children shared that after spending time with family, they then missed that family time once school started again. Others mentioned that when they're away from school, they "forget everything."

These feelings are completely normal. Transitions — even short ones — can stir up mixed emotions. Missing family time or feeling unsure about lessons shows how much children care about both home and school.

To help your child settle back in:

- **Talk about the change.** Let them share what they enjoyed about the break and what they're looking forward to at school.
- **Revisit routines.** Predictable mornings and evenings help children feel calm and secure.
- **Remind them of their strengths.** A week off doesn't mean they've forgotten everything — those skills and memories return quickly!
- **Stay connected.** A bit of shared time after school — chatting, walking, or reading together — helps keep that family closeness.

And for our next holiday, why not **create a simple calendar together**? Decorate it with pictures of favourite characters, animals, or books, and use it to count down the days until school starts again. This can help children feel prepared for the return while keeping the fun of the holiday alive.
