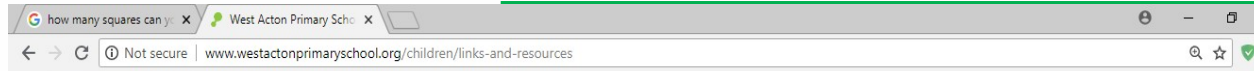

S IS FOR SAFE
Never give out personal information to strangers on the internet. Personal information includes things like your home address and your birthday.

M IS FOR MEET
Never ever meet up with a stranger you have met online unless a parent or guardian has said it is ok and is present. Never, never, never, never, never.

A IS FOR ACCEPTING
Don't open emails from people you don't know, they could contain viruses. If you get a strange email from a friend and you think they might have a virus make sure you let them know!

R IS FOR RELIABLE
Don't believe everything you read online, check your facts! Did you read it on a reliable website like the BBC? Are other websites saying the same thing? Does it tell you where they got the information from?

T IS FOR TELL
If you have an online safety problem, make sure you tell someone. Tell a parent, guardian, or teacher as soon you can.

What will your child be learning?

Year 6 is a pivotal year when we prepare the children for high school. We have high hopes and expectations of learning behaviour and appreciate your support with this.

Themed learning topics will be taught each half term including:

- The Impact of World War One and Two In Acton
- Global Warming and Climate Change
- Ancient Greeks
- Our World in the Future
- Journeys – where does our stuff come from?
- History of me and my family and my time at West Acton

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- We cover the National Curriculum subjects : Maths, English, PSHE, Reading, Computing, Science, History, Geography, Art, DT, Music, PE, Spanish, RE and Collective Worship
- Each term our curriculum overview will be uploaded onto the school website

Mornings



- **The gate opens at 8:30am so children can start lining up**
- **Children must be in the classroom by 8:45 for registration.**
- **Support staff are in key areas to welcome pupils and take important messages to teachers.**
- **This ensures a calm and structured start to the day.**



School starts at 8.45am

Drop off your child to line up between 8.30am and 8.45am.

Children must be ready to enter the classroom at 8.45am to start learning.



Pick-up

Pick-up time at the end of the day is 3:15pm

- If you are unable to pick up your child and have arranged for someone else to do this, please let the school know as soon as possible.
- We cannot send your child home with someone that we do not recognise or have not been informed about - even if your child knows them.
- Once you have picked your child/children up, please do not stay in the playground as it is a safety risk.
- If you would like your child to walk home on their own, we require a signed permission slip.

Reading



At West Acton Primary School, we value the importance of reading and we encourage a love of reading.

All pupils visit the school **Library** once a week to choose a book for reading pleasure. This might be read with you or by you at home for enjoyment, for example: before bedtime to help them relax.

Weds- Tamarind

Thurs- Zaytouna and Lime



All pupils will have a **Home Reading Book** for their book bag that matches their reading level and must be read **5 times a week for homework for 20 minutes.**

When pupils are in Key Stage 2, they are encouraged to write their own comments and sign their Reading Records themselves gradually more as they get older. However, we ask that parents of children in Key Stage 2 still listen to their child read and comment and sign in Reading Records at least once a week.

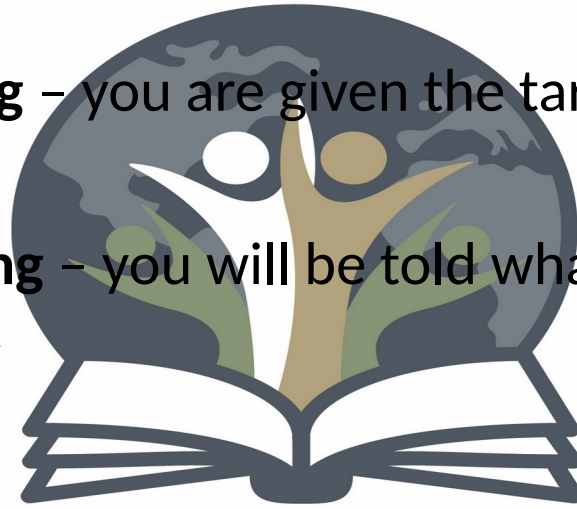
Reading records are checked daily by teachers

Out of these 5 sessions of reading homework in a week, we ask that pupils read online once a week, using **Bug Club**, where they have been allocated Home Reading books at their reading level and go on to answer questions about what they have read. This is checked weekly by school staff.



How do you know about your child's progress?

- **October: Parent/Carer Evening** – you are given the targets for the year.
- **February: Parent/Carer Evening** – you will be told what level your child is and if they are making expected progress.
- **July:**
Written Report – you will be told where your child is in relation to national expectations
SATS results- will be handed out
- **Autumn and Spring: Book Looks** - coming in to look at your child's books or we will send copies of the work home (depending upon restrictions).



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Key Stage 2 Assessments

- KS2 SATS tests are scheduled for week commencing **Monday 11th May 2026**
- We will be having a SATS meeting later in the year (around February time) and will be able to answer all of your questions at that time.
- For the time being, please encourage your child to develop good routines such as completing their home learning and reading every day.



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Things to keep in mind

- We are helping your child become independent learners.
- One way we will be doing this is by showing them how to use their reading record as a diary to organise their activities- this will be an expectation once they are in high school.
- We will help children to choose when to do their homework throughout the week and write the due dates in their diary.

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Homework

Reading: Monday- Friday- 20 mins a day
Reading records will be checked daily by teachers.

Bug club: Once a week- 20 mins
Bugclub reports checked weekly on a Friday.

Spelling: Two lots of spelling:

Daily- 5 mins – will be sent home every Wednesday- Children need to score 8/10 weekly.
Weekly- 20 mins- Practise year 5 and 6 words (words can be found in their reading record).

CGP books: 30 mins a week- 3 CGP books will be given out- SATS Boosters-10 min each
Set and checked every Friday

TT rockstars: Four times a week- 5 mins **daily**

Children will also have access to **online resources** including Purple Mash.

Lunch time homework club:

We will have a once a week lunch time club for anyone who has not managed to complete homework that week.

Children who consistently don't complete homework will be sent to Miss Kondo for a detention.

Safeguarding

Keeping your child safe and happy is paramount at West Acton Primary School. Your child's class teacher will inform the leadership team of any behaviour or safeguarding concerns.

As part of the school's safeguarding policy and procedures, a member of the senior leadership may call you to inform you of an incident and sanction given.

If the matter is related to a safeguarding concern and a referral is made to the Ealing's Social Care, Miss Sanusi (Deputy Headteacher and DSL) or Ms Kondo (Headteacher and Deputy Designated Safeguarding Lead) will call parents to discuss the incident beforehand and explain why a referral is being made.

Due to the nature of safeguarding, parents may be informed after the referral has been made or not informed at all if it could put the child at risk. This is in line with Ealing's Social Care practice and procedures.





Children with medical needs



Short-term medication

If your child requires prescribed medication to be taken during the school day, parents must complete a **short-term medication form** which can be collected from the school's office. The completed form and prescribed medication must be brought to the school's office and collected when the prescription is completed.

Long-term medications

For children who require medication long-term, parents will need to complete the **long-term medication form** which can be collected in the school office and returned with the prescribed medications. The school require two sets of medications e.g. two inhalers and spacers as one set of medication is kept in the child's classroom and another is kept in the Medical room.

If you require a letter from the school for your G.P. to issue a second set of medication, please email the school office.

The school's office can advise you on which prescribed medication can be accepted in the school.

Expired medications

Parents will receive an email from Medical Tracker notifying them that their child's medication will be expiring soon. Please ensure replacement medication is requested from your doctor early and brought into school before your child's medication expiry date. Your child may not be allowed to go on a school trip if their medication has expired and replacement medications have not been provided to the school. This is part of the school's risk assessment and safeguarding procedures.

Mobile phones

No smart phones allowed on site- children may bring a phone which is unable to access the internet for walking to and from school.

Phone will be turned off, collected in and locked away in the mornings and returned at the end of the day.

Phones are not to be switched on until your child has left the school gates.
