




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English Writing Update Y6 for Spring 1







The next half-term Year 6 are reading William Shakespeare's Macbeth. Our text is a re-telling of William Shakespeare's classic about a noble and courageous man named Macbeth, who is happy to serve his master, King Duncan. Then, after a chance meeting, the seed of ambition is planted into his mind. Gripped with the same desire, Lady Macbeth pushes her husband to gain even more power, with terrible consequences.

Our Writing Outcomes will be:

Narrative

Grammar and punctuation

The children will add clauses to sentences, at the beginning, middle and end, use different verb forms such as simple, progressive and perfect, they will make concise word choices using examples of vocabulary from the text, use a wider range of openers and link their writing together (cohesion). We will also develop our use of figurative language such as simile, metaphor, personification and alliterations.

Handwriting

All children will focus on using a neat, legible joined-up style of handwriting as this is the requirement in Year 6.

Deceptive

-Fools others. Tells lies or pretends to be good on the outside. Decelt, Deceptively

Claustrophobic

-Shut off. Can make people feel enclosed or imprisoned. Claustrophobia, Claustrophobically
