Year 6 had a visit from a historian who shared insights into World War One, helping pupils deepen their understanding of this important period in history. Year 3 stepped back even further in time during their Portals to the Past Ancient Greek Day, where pupils immersed themselves in ancient culture and learning through hands-on activities.

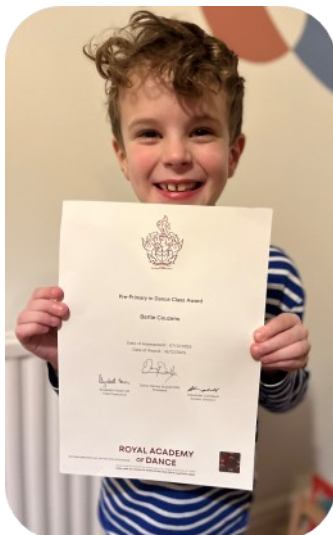
