Staff were impressed by how much they remembered from last term about minarets and the wudu washing ritual. A big thank-you to

They then visited Gloucester Cathedral, where the children learnt that it is the 'mother church' of

Gloucestershire because it houses Bishop Rachel's Cathedral chair. They marvelled at what was once the largest window in the world, about half the size of the Yorkley playground and measured one of the pillars at an impressive seven children wide!






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Also as part of their trip, the children loved getting hands-on with their learning, creating their own stained-glass windows and pinch pots complete with candles.

Mercury Class has been exploring the fascinating world of electricity, with a particular focus on electric circuits. Working like real scientists, the children discovered that a circuit must be complete for electricity to flow and for a bulb to light. They then took their learning a step further by adding their own switches, allowing them to turn the bulb on and off.



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
Michael Rosen Day:
