

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New School Menu starting from 3 November 2025!

Here is a letter from FM Catering and Bradford Local Authority

in collaboration with the University of York:

Dear Parents and Carers

As you will recall our school has been selected to take part in an exciting project called "Transformation Towards Healthy and Sustainable School Meals" (Green Menus).

This initiative is being led by the FixOurFood team at the University of York, in partnership with Bradford City Council and aims to develop new school food menus that not only support children's health but also help to look after the planet.

During the development stage, children from your child's school also took part in a tasting event to help make any improvements to the meals. As part of the project, our school will be introducing a new two-week menu on a trial basis for 12 weeks starting 3rd November 2025.

This menu will feature 6 brand new dishes:-

- Cowboy Sausage and Beans
- Loaded Mexican-Style Wedges
- Indian-style Sausage Roll
- Creamy Cauli Mac 'N' Cheese and Peas
- Curry Club Dahl Chickpeas and a Coriander Yogurt
- Coronation Chickpea Sandwich


Throughout the 12-week period, the FixOurFood team will visit the school on three separate occasions during the lunchtime period. During these visits, they will:-

- Observe lunchtimes and take photos of the plates of food the children choose (please note: no photos of children will be taken),
- Interview our head chef to hear their thoughts on the new and improved recipes,
- Invite a small number of children to take part in a focus group to share their views and experiences of the menus. You will get a separate letter about this if your child is invited to this group. We believe this is a fantastic opportunity for our school community to contribute to shaping healthier and more sustainable school meals for the future.

We are excited to see how our children respond to the new dishes and to play an active role in this important project. Please be assured that no child will go hungry during this trial as there is likely to always be a more familiar dish on the menu.

This letter is for information only and you do not have to do anything different. All of the same information will be provided about the school meals and any allergy information will be considered in the same way as usual. 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Holidays in term time

From now, requested for leave in term time will need to be completed on the Bradford Council website and NOT school:

https://bso.bradford.gov.uk/content/education-safeguarding/attendance/leave-of-absence-e-form

We are reasoning an increasing number of requests for holidays in term time during this first week back in school!

From August 2024, the fine for school absences across the country will be £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid within 28 days. In the case of repeated fines, if a parent receives a second fine for the same child within any three-year period, this will be charged at the higher rate of £160. Fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action like a parenting order or prosecution will be considered.

If you're prosecuted and attend court because your child hasn't been attending school, you could get a fine of up to £2,500.

Money raised via fines is only used by the local authority to cover the costs of administering the system, and to fund attendance support. Any extra money is returned to the government. **The money is not given to school.**

We hope that you will look at the calendar on the school website for 2025-26 to check when our school holidays are planned before booking your holiday or trip abroad.

Wraparound Care - Breakfast Club and Afterschool Club::

Breakfast Club is for pupils in Nursery (ONLY 4 years old and above), Reception to Year 6. It runs daily from 7.45am until the start of school. Our After School Club runs daily for pupils from Reception to Year 6 from 3:15pm until 6pm.

Children who are in receipt of PPG are attend the breakfast club at no cost.

If you would like your child to attend the afterschool club provision, please email the school office, office@poplarsfarm.bradford.sch.uk stating your child/children's names, classes and dates you would like your child to attend the provision including their pick up times after.

Please note that if your child or children's Parent Pay account does not have sufficient funds for them to attend the breakfast and afterschool club, we will not be able to offer them a place.

Breakfast Club -7:45am - Start of School -£1.50 per session which includes breakfast (FSM children no charge, this does not include UIFSM)

Afterschool Club – 15:15pm – 16:30pm collection - £4.00 per session which includes a drink and light snack Afterschool Club – 15:15pm up to 18:00pm collection - £6.00 per session which includes tea.





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Our charges still remain much lower than other provisions!



All payments must be made in advance on ParentPay for a child attending our wrap-around care.

Please see a member of the office staff if you need support with this.
